## History of the Jefferson Committee on Research

- Established September 2014-2015
- Based on the long-standing CoR of Sidney Kimmel Medical College
- Includes membership from each of Jefferson Center City colleges: Pharmacy, Population Health, Health Professions, Nursing
- Later expanded to include membership from administrative divisions that intersect with the research community - including Scott Memorial Library, IS&T, Innovation Pillar, and Marketing, now comprising about 20% of the JCoR membership

# Grant Mentoring

- Optimize grant applications by providing applicants with feedback with respect to strategy, and substantive science issues
- Internal peer review
- Other modalities being considered including input during early stages of proposal development

## Intramural Grant Opportunities

- DTSA - This award mechanism was designed to enhance the success of Jefferson's research faculty and to nurture the development of HIGH-IMPACT SCIENCE. The intent is to catalyze Transformational Science initiatives driven by Jefferson faculty and to enable the generation of pivotal data that will form the basis of new extramural grant submissions
- Provost's Pilot Clinical Research Award - This award mechanism was designed to help researchers obtain clinical research data that would justify a more expansive study funded by extramural sources and foster new collaborative efforts between clinicians and researchers
- New opportunities in development for Scholarly Inquiry intramural funding

## JeffSolves

- This program has brought together faculty members from across the Jefferson community in crowdsourcing events aimed at generating innovative approaches to as yet unsolved problems
- The experience is aimed at generating new ideas through the development of new collaborations between our faculty
- While originally established to address diseases that lack effective treatments and could benefit from new therapies developed at Jefferson, we are opening this program to all new aspects of the Jefferson community - ideas welcomed
