Approval of the Agenda

Prof. Howard called the meeting to order on Tuesday, December 16, 2014 at 12:33 p.m. in the Kanbar Performance Space. The agenda was approved with the updates previously sent out.

Approval of the Minutes of the November 18, 2014 Full Faculty Meeting

Prof. Howard asked for any corrections to the minutes of the November 18, 2014 faculty meeting; no corrections were made, thus, the minutes were approved.

Reports of the Provost / Dean of Faculty

Provost

Provost Randy Swearer

Congratulated those that went up for review this past cycle. Everyone was renewed. Dr. Swearer read the list. Those that went through the teaching portfolio workshops...it made a difference that was noticed. Dr. Swearer announced that Megan Wood was hired for the restructured position of Manager of Faculty Affairs. She will start in January 2015. He thanked everyone involved, including Matt Baker and Valerie Hanson. Additionally, Carla Mandell has taken on the role of Coordinator of Academic Events, which involved Commencement and Convocation.

Dr. Swearer spoke about visits we have had this past semester from Harvard, Politecnico di Milano and Paris Lodron University as well as Napier University in Scotland. These visits were not invited, but the visit was warmly welcomed. Last week, Dr. Swearer attended The Knowledge Conference at Rotman in Toronto. Approximately 200 were in attendance. He then was invited by Roger Martin to attend a smaller group of 10 for the second day to sit at the table with Tim Brown of IDEO, Administrators from Harvard and other universities for a deeper discussion. Dr. Swearer thanks the faculty for Philadelphia University being recognized.

Faculty Manual Revision Update

Hallmark Update

The Hallmarks section of the website has been updated. Students will begin to post artifacts. New Business

Nexus Abroad

Prof. Phil Tiemeyer

Prof. Tiemeyer presented a Powerpoint presentation on what is Nexus Abroad. Being offered this spring is one CAFE class, one DEC class and SHLA class being run at the same time. This one is designed for freshman. However, other students may apply. 17 freshman have applied and an equal number of upperclassmen. The goal will attract collaborative faculty as well. If you are interested in participating, please see Phil Tiemeyer to get involved. Cultural proficiencies play a key part in being involved in the program.

There will be a cohesive core to bring the 3 disciplines together. Professors design their courses to be linked, by a common theme or a common methodology. For this first group, history will be the core element. It runs for 3 weeks in summer, right after May graduation.

Look for an application in your email later today. Faculty will receive an application for a short course and a separate one for Nexus Abroad. Applications are due on Sunday February 15, 2015. Any questions, please contact Phil Tiemeyer.

Motion – 2/3 Threshold Vote

Dr. Howard gave background history of this vote, which was emailed to the faculty 10 days prior to today's meeting. This is part of the Organization of the Faculty document which is not part of the Faculty Manual. This language was omitted inadvertently when this document was created. There is a motion to add it back in. Motion was made and seconded. It was questioned if we were already following it,

why is a vote needed? It was also addressed that this vote would require 2/3 of the full faculty to vote positively before any change can be made instead of 2/3 of the voting faculty. Right now a non-vote counts as a No vote. An electronic vote will take place based on the simple majority of the faculty that vote.
